





# FRANCE




France is known for looking like a hexagon with five sides. Paris is the capital city, and has 2.5 million inhabitants!



The French flag has three equal parts – in the order blue, white and red. Color in the French flag!

# PARIS LAYOUT




Paris is made up of 20 'arrondissements,' or districts, that spiral out from the center. They are in the form of a snail ('escargot' in French!), and as you explore Paris you can check the street signs to see which arrondissement you are in.

Do you know which arrondissement you will stay in? Mark it on the map, and color in the 'escargot'!



# PARIS LAYOUT



Paris has so many monuments, parks and museums to visit!

The city is divided by the Seine river, which runs across the city.

There are two islands in the center of the city — the Ile de la Cité (where Notre Dame cathedral is) and the Ile Saint Louis (named after French King Louis IX).

Deux tickets, s'il vous plaît. - Two (carrousel) tickets, please.


Les toilettes — The bathroom

Parlez-vous anglais? - Do you speak English?





# EIFFEL TOWER



- The Eiffel Tower was built in 1889 as the entrance to the World's Fair, and to mark the 100 year anniversary of the French Revolution. It was the tallest building in the world at the time!
- The Eiffel Tower was meant to be torn down after 20 years.
- The Eiffel Tower is actually three shades of brown the darkest color is at the bottom, while the lightest is at the top.
- Visit at dusk to see the Eiffel Tower sparkle on the hour!


## LOUVRE MUSEUM





- The Louvre museum is the world's largest AND most famous museum!
- It has not always been a museum though in the 1100s it was a fortress, and then in the 1500s it became a royal palace.
- The Louvre contains over 380,000 pieces of artwork, and is the most visited museum in the world.
- The iconic pyramids were added to the Louvre courtyard in the 1980s to modernize the space.

## THE MONA LISA




Draw Mona Lisa's face – is she smiling?

The Mona Lisa painting is at the Louvre museum.
It is considered the most famous painting in the world!
But WHY is she so famous?


WELL — it all goes back to 1911 when a Louvre handyman stole the painting, and it was missing for almost 3 years! During that time, the world fell in love with the painting and voila! It became the most famous artwork in the world!




#### NOTRE DAME CATHEDRAL



- Notre Dame is over 860 years old! It is a catholic church.
- The 'kilometer zero of France', where all the roads of the country start, is located right in front of Notre Dame.
- In April 2019, a catastrophic fire engulfed Notre-Dame, almost destroying the church!


#### NOTRE DAME CATHEDRAL



The Notre Dame Cathedral is famous for it's beautiful stained glass windows, including the rose windows that are round and look like a flower.

## ARC DE TRIOMPHE



- The Arc de Triomphe was completed in 1836 after 30 years of construction. It is modeled after a Roman arch.
- It was commissioned by Napoleon, a famous French ruler, to celebrate France's military triumphs.
- Beneath the Arc de Triomphe lies the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, a tribute to the unidentified soldiers who lost their lives in battle. There is a ceremony with the lighting of a flame every evening.



## MONTMARTRE



Montmartre is a neighborhood in the 18<sup>th</sup> arrondissement, at the top of the hill—it is known for it's artistic history, with artists like Picasso and Van Gogh living there! Today, artists gather at the top of the hill at the Place du Tertre to draw and paint. You can have your portrait done here.

## SACRÉ COEUR BASILICA






#### FUN FACTS



- This church sits at the top of the hill in Montmartre.
- It's home to France's largest bell it took 21 horses to carry it up the hill in 1895, and remains one of the largest bells in the world!
- The church is self-cleaning! It stays bright white thanks to calcite in the stone, which acts as a natural bleach!

#### MOULIN ROUGE



- The Moulin Rouge is a cabaret, or somewhere with dance shows and dinner.
- 'Moulin' means windmill, and 'Rouge' means red so it is literally the 'Red Windmill.'
- The Moulin Rouge was built in the Montmartre neighborhood in 1889 for the World's Fair festival, just like the Eiffel Tower!



### PARIS PARKS

#### **LUXEMBOURG GARDENS**

#### **TUILERIES GARDENS**



The Tuileries Gardens are just outside the Louvre Museum, and the perfect spot to visit after a museum!



Find the carrousel, trampolines and playground on the northwest side of the park.


### THE METRO



The most common way to get around Paris is by riding the metro, or Paris subway.

### THE EURO

In France, the currency is the Euro – this is like the dollar or pound. It is used throughout most of Europe.






